



4,000,000 Telephones are reconnecting after thirty five years with the original four members, Richard, Malcom Tent, Eg Lucas and Carl Antony Plover releasing their first single in over three decades. 'Goats' is the first single taken from their forthcoming album released via download on Friday April 16, 2021.

Originally recorded in 1986, 'Goats' was part of a collection of unreleased material recorded by the band along with Jack Rabelais and Rick Woolgar. Dedicated to his memory, the track features the solo and arrangement by saxophonist, Rick Woolgar.

After releasing their self titled first album 4,000,000 Telephones to critical acclaim, through their own label Bunker Records, the band went on to release the 7inch and 12 inch single 'French Girls', signing to Summer House Records.

Before the original line up broke up, the band were half way through the second album, which never saw the light of day. Thirty five years later, plans are now afoot to put out this unreleased material in the autumn of 2021.

4,000,000 Telephones gained national press in the UK, regularly featured in Melody Maker and play-listed by John Peel and Janice Long on BBC Radio 1. NME featured the band as most likely candidates for better things, before proving them wrong. They also toured Germany gaining national German music press and a TV appearance.

4,000,000 Telephones are a collision of six minds from different musical directions creating a fascinating melée of musical styles that delighted and baffled by equal measure. As well as the more contemporary elements of punk and funk that were widespread at the time the music was also interjected with moments of country, jazz, pop and progressive rock.

Looking forward, not just backwards, with new material and recording projects planned. 4,000,000 Telephones have reengaged.
